## Leaving a positive mark on the planet

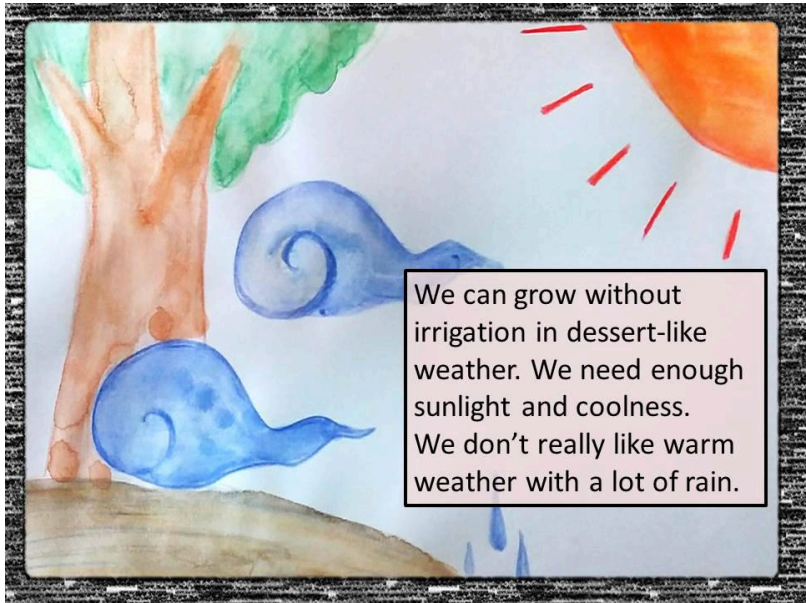

“ No-till farming comes from this simple idea. As soil in Uzbekistan is fertile even without cultivating, farmers can use no-till farming to plant seeds without mixing the soil in and out, but just by making a sharp cut where seeds can be planted.
