# UNV outlined a Strategic Framework for 2014-2017 that has focused on harnessing the power of volunteers and volunteerism to support the achievement of internationally-agreed goals. The Framework guides UNV's work over four years and calls for working more systematically with United Nations partners to jointly deliver projects and programmes that can make significant impacts on peace and development worldwide. It also aims to help countries more effectively integrate volunteerism within national frameworks, enabling better engagement of people in development processes.

## WHAT WE DO

UNV supports peace and sustainable human development around the globe through the promotion of volunteerism and mobilization of volunteers. It is active in 126 countries, with over 90 field units and a number of regional offices.

In 2016, UNV directly mobilized almost 6,600 UN Volunteers to serve either in their own countries or abroad. These UN Volunteers contributed to the peace and development projects and initiatives of 30 United Nations system partners. About 83 per cent of UN Volunteers came from countries of the global South. Almost 40 per cent of UN Volunteers were assigned within their own countries.

UNV's Online Volunteering service connects United Nations entities, civil society organizations and public institutions directly with capable and motivated individuals. In 2016, some 12,500 UN Online Volunteers engaged in development over the internet, completing over 22,600 assignments.

#### OUR PLAN

The UNV Strategic Framework 2014-2017 directs UNV efforts and programme resources into five priority areas: securing access to basic social services; community resilience for environment and disaster risk reduction; peace building; youth; and national capacity development through volunteer schemes.

UNV also focuses on building a credible body of knowledge informed by research, innovation and evidence in order to advocate and enhance the integration of volunteerism into peace and development programming. Throughout, innovation is a cross-cutting pillar of our work.

UNV is currently in the process of evaluating its results and performance against the current framework and working with partners to develop a strategic framework to cover 2018-2021.
