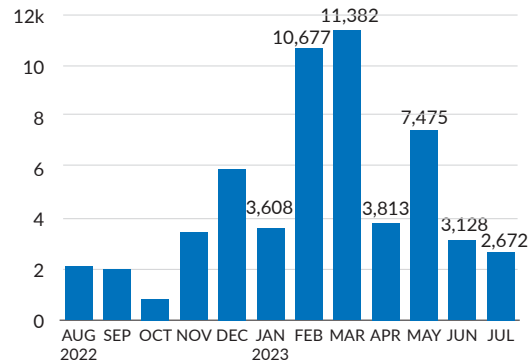

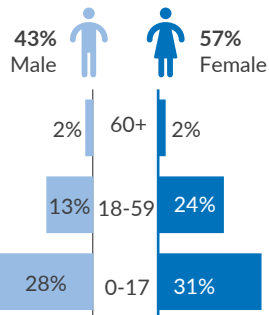

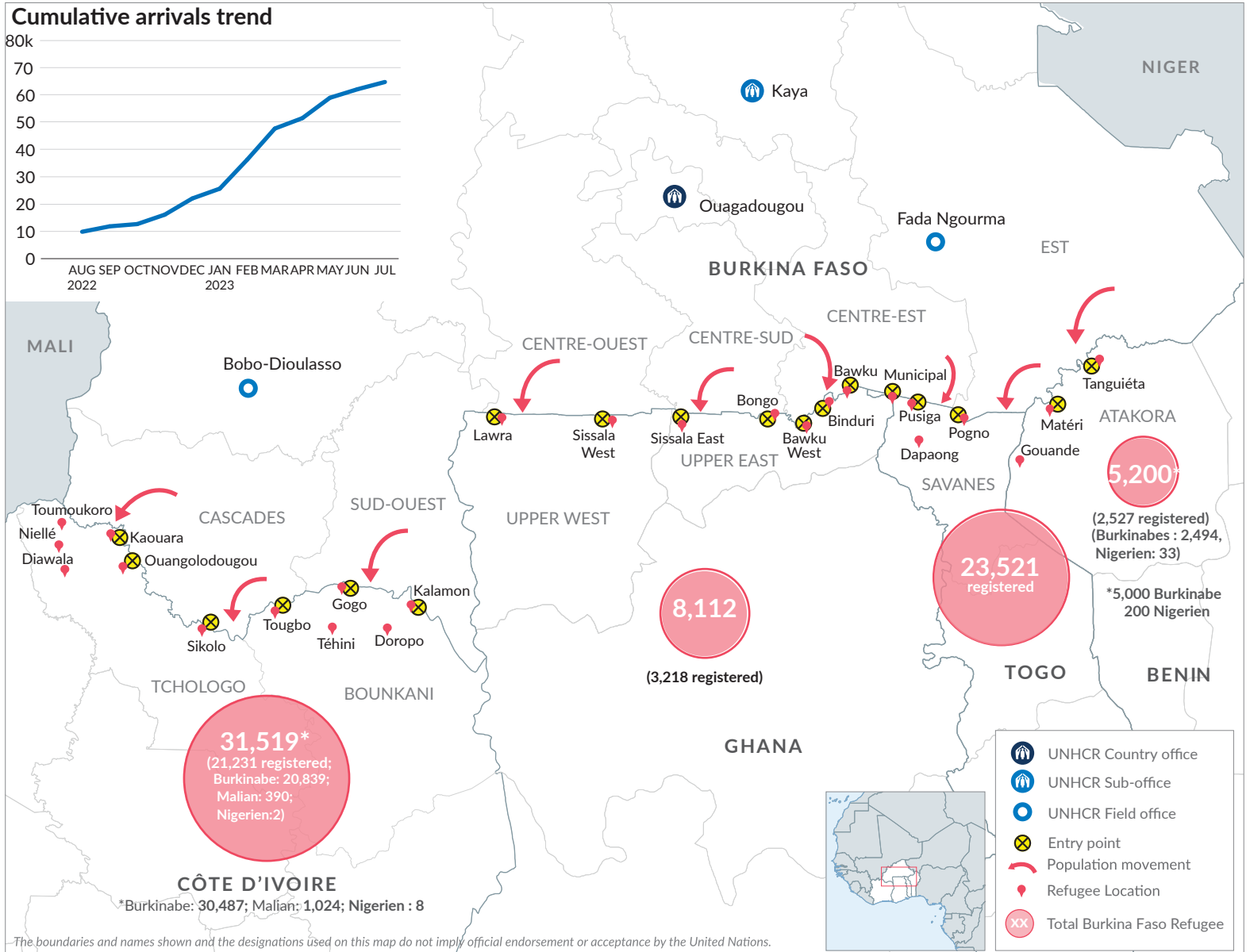
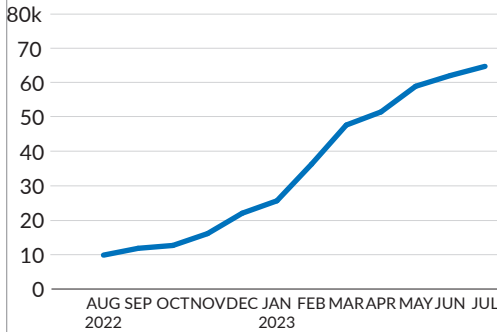

Togo



WASH



- Limited access to drinking;
- Demarcation of open defecation areas, Lack of latrines and showers in some households that have received displaced people;
- Low coverage of drinking water points in Bagré Centre;
- Low coverage of drinking water points
- Difficult access to drinking water

Shelter/NFI



- Rent for most displaced persons (precarious houses)
- Overcrowding in host families leading
- Lack of food assistance

Education



- Less than 50% of displaced children go to school
- Insufficient bench space (student sitting on mats)
- Overcrowding in classrooms
- Insufficient school buildings
- Lack of school canteens

Protection



- Difficulty in obtaining information on gender-based violence in CINKASSE for socio-cultural reasons
- Lack of psychosocial assistance

Livelihood



- Difficult access to cultivable land by IDPs due to their double displacement
- Large exodus of young displaced people
- Lack of IGAs for displaced families

Health



- Lack of psychological support
- No health centre within 5 km
- Limited access to menstrual hygiene management kits

Nutrition



- Shortage of inputs in the management of malnourished cases

Cote d'Ivoire

Relocalisation

In Notadouo (Boukani)

630 shelters completed and habitable (out of 1500 planned shelters);
04 water points being finalized;
20 blocks of latrines under construction.

In Niornigue (Tchologo)

315 shelters completed and habitable (out of 1080 shelters planned)
500 shelters in elevation.
04 water points finalized
50 blocks of latrines under construction.



Ghana

- 1.. Total capacity of Tarikom Reception Center is 2,280 (average of 4 people per tent)
- 2.. The center host 140 family tents and 420 emergency shelters
- 3..Type of assistance provided to 286 individuals that have migrated to the center:
 - Wet food (3 rations a day) ,
 - WASH,
 - medical screening & referral,
 - protection case management,
 - security,
 - solid waste management disposal
- 4..The assistance listed above is provided by:
 - UNHCR: CRIs, and transportation from relocation area to reception center,
 - CARITAS NABOCADO: wetfood, health referrals and inscription in National Health Insurance, protection (GBV and child protection case management);
 - World Vision: Water and sanitation);
 - Ghana Refugee Board camp management, shelter allocation and registration;
 - Ghana Health Service: health screening and vaccination;
 - Ghana Police: security services;
 - Environmental Health Department: solid residue disposal.
